





WHY INDIAZAKAT EXISTS



India has immense Zakat potential. Yet, traditional distribution often suffers from fragmentation, lack of verification, delayed disbursement, and limited longterm impact.

IndiaZakat was launched in 2020 to address these gaps by:

01

Bringing structure and transparency to Zakat distribution

02

Ensuring Shariah compliant verification of beneficiaries

03

Leveraging technology for speed, accountability, & reporting

04

Protecting beneficiary dignity at every step

IndiaZakat was created to transform Zakat from sporadic relief into sustainable impact.

SIX-YEAR JOURNEY 2020-2025

Launched during the uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic, IndiaZakat began as an urgent response to crisis. Over time, it evolved into a national platform serving multiple causes across states and various geographies.

From emergency relief to structured education support, from individual cases to institutional partnerships – the journey reflects consistent growth rooted in trust.


